

Supercamp 2008

Once the registrar receives your registration, you will receive a confirmation. Then you can get ready for camp.

- Plan to arrive at Camp Palmer on Friday April 25th, **NO EARLIER THAN 6:45 PM and NO LATER THAN 7:15**. Registration lines form alphabetically in the Dining hall at 6:45. There will be a courtesy corps of counselors waiting to help you move in and to answer your questions.
- We do not serve dinner on Friday evening, so be sure your child has eaten. We do provide the traditional snack of Supercamp Soup on Friday evening.
- Supercamp will end at 2pm on Sunday, April 30th. You are invited to arrive no earlier than 1:45 and observe our special “friendship closing circle.” The Quilt raffle winner will also be drawn at that time.
- Packing suggestions: **LABEL EVERYTHING** including your clothes. Use baggies for loose items such as barrettes, watches, etc. Every year we have a giant box of lost and found.
- Optional – Materials for skits and campfire. Extra silly hats, costumes, these always come in handy at camp.
- Camp living policy – Campers will be staying in heated cabins in a semi-rustic environment. The boys and girls stay in separate areas of camp. A licensed nurse will be on the premises along with over 15 adults. There are at least 2 counselors per cabin. Bathrooms are in nearby blockhouse facilities. Campers do pitch in with cabin and camp clean up. Dishes and meal duty are shared equally in a rotation.

What to bring:

- Sturdy shoes – an extra pair too
- Boots
- Outdoor play clothes
- Warm clothing – the layered approach
- A WARM sleeping bag – a slumber bag may not be enough in the spring woods
- Any night-time items – your stuffed animal, favorite pjs and blanket
- Flashlight
- Labeled Medications – keep it in the original container and put them in a ZipLok bag with your child’s name, your name, and phone number along with instructions written clearly in permanent marker on the outside. (Turn in to nurse at registration)
- Towel, washcloth, soap and other toiletries
- Your can of Soup – for our SOUPER Friday snack (any kind you like.)
- Jacket or windbreaker
- Extra pillowcase for dirty clothes

What NOT to bring:

Radios, matches, knives or other inappropriate items. Food is discouraged in the cabins – it brings critters in and adds to clean up.
